

# FLYING SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION FORM 2019



The aim of the Warbirds Over Wanaka Community Trust Flying Scholarships (WOW) is to address one of the risks identified around the future sustainability of our Airshow – a possible lack of Warbird display pilots in future years. The Trust is looking for younger pilots, passionate about Warbirds who wish to have access to these aircraft with a view to flying them.

## Scholarships

- Each scholarship is approximately to the value of \$5000. It covers aircraft hire, insurance, fuel and instruction.
- One or two scholarships will be awarded annually to an individual or group of pilots who might require some specific training and the Scholarship should be taken up within a year of acceptance of the scholarship.

## Qualification criteria

- The applicant must have a minimum of 200 hours as PIC.
- The applicant must be over the age of 18 and under the age of 50 by the time he/she would receive the scholarship award.
- The applicant must be a NZ resident

## Timeline

- Applications open from 2nd July and close on 30th August 2019
- Successful applicants will be announced by the end of October 2019.

## Terms and Conditions

- *The applicant must be prepared to pay for any other costs eg airfares and accommodation, whilst taking up the scholarship*
- *The scholarship will cover the costs of tuition, fuel and aircraft time up to the value of the Scholarship and will be paid directly to the aircraft owner and/or instructor.*
- *Once the aircraft and instructor has been sourced by WOW the scholarship recipient must organise their own training times with the aircraft owner and instructor.*
- *The scholarship recipient must be available for media interviews and coverage in conjunction with WOW's media policies.*
- *The decision of the WOW Judging Panel is final and no correspondence will be entered into. The panel has the discretion to not award a scholarship in any year.*
- *Applications to be received at the WOW Office by 4pm on 30th August 2019.*
- *If the applicant does not respond to the scholarship offer by the date outlined in the offer letter, his/her scholarship will be rescinded.*
